Ranjit Singh Museum: Dedicated to Maharaja Ranjit Singh, founder of the Sikh Empire, this museum showcases his life through artifacts, paintings, and personal items. Housed in his former summer palace, it adds a touch of royal history to Amritsar's cultural landscape.
