Birla Temple: The Birla Mandir in Hyderabad, a resplendent white marble temple dedicated to Lord Venkateswara, crowns a hilltop overlooking the city with sweeping panoramic views of Hussain Sagar Lake and beyond. Built by the Birla family in 1976, it marries South Indian temple architecture with Rajasthani craftsmanship, featuring intricate carvings of deities and serene sanctums that inspire devotion. The temple glows majestically when illuminated at night, drawing worshippers and tourists who climb its steps for both spiritual solace and the stunning vistas, offering a perfect blend of divinity and architectural elegance in Hyderabad's bustling landscape.

Birla Planetarium: The Birla Planetarium in Hyderabad, housed within a distinctive dome-shaped structure, offers an enchanting journey through the cosmos with cutting-edge sky shows that unravel the mysteries of stars, planets, and galaxies.
